Dear parent,

An important element of this year's 'GAP' priorities is to build on the work undertaken with a small group of parents last year. The outcome of that work was a series of five animated films aimed at raising the awareness of school staff of the additional challenges that some parents of military families face in relation to their SEND children. These films have been very well received - if you haven't seen them, I include links to them at the end of this letter.

We would now like to invite you to join a new parents' working party, representative of all seven GAP schools. The purpose of this group will be to support me and the headteachers in creating a 'Parental Engagement Protocol' (or Charter) to be advertised and used by all schools, including Leeming (RAF) Primary 'down the road', particularly in relation to SEND provision. This, it is hoped, will add consistency to all garrison schools' offer.

It is <u>not</u> anticipated that such a working party will meet that often – perhaps a 2-3 sessions before the end of the academic year, alongside some email communication. Depending on the composition and availability of group members, some meetings might be virtual. Ideally, most of the group's members will have children with SEND – and **all** will need to be from current or former Forces Families.

I'd like to have the working party in place by half-term – so responses are needed by **Friday 14**th **February**. Please do consider supporting the project as parental input is vital.

The purpose of these films is to help school staff, and other professionals, gain a greater awareness of the difficulties that some Armed Forces families with children with special educational needs and / or disabilities (SEND) face.
