The 'I Belong' certificate is awarded by the NCCE, a leading body for computing education in England.

Risedale School Headteacher, Mrs Greenwood, said: "Encouraging more girls to explore pathways into STEM-based careers is not only a national and international priority, it is a school priority. I am passionate about the empowerment of young women and this wonderful programme supports them to consider computer science in a different light, raises awareness of gender balance in STEM subjects and champions equality. Respect is at the heart of equality and that is what we wish to nurture at Risedale."

Head of Computer Science at Risedale, Mrs Rodgers, said: "I've always been passionate about encouraging more girls to pursue Computing and receiving the I Belong certificate is a tremendous honour and a testament to our ongoing commitment to inclusion through



technology. This achievement marks an important step, but our work doesn't end here. I'm confident that together, we can continue to make a meaningful impact and drive greater gender balance in Computing and STEM."



opportunity. Smith coolly converted the resulting penalty, sending the Bedale goalkeeper the wrong way and giving his team a deserved lead.

For much of the first half, Risedale controlled possession and dictated the tempo. However, Bedale proved dangerous on the counterattack, managing to score twice on either side of the halftime break, briefly putting Risedale behind.

This setback spurred Risedale into action. Matthew Senivota rose to the occasion, first levelling the score with a powerful header from a perfectly delivered Corey Hillman corner. Senivota then demonstrated his composure, slotting home a well-placed shot from just outside the box, assisted by a clever pass from Blair Campbell.

With renewed confidence, Risedale seized control of the match. Corey Hillman, who had already contributed an assist, added to the tally by pouncing on a rebound after a strong save from the Bedale keeper. Alex Stephenson sealed the victory with another well-executed strike from distance, putting the game beyond Bedale's reach. The final whistle blew, confirming Risedale's 5-2 victory and their progression to the next round of the cup.

#### MP Rishi Sunak Visits Risedale School

Rishi Sunak visited Risedale School in February to hear the new Headteacher set out a new vision for the school.

He met Mrs Greenwood who outlined her vision to improve standards at the secondary school and have the school at the heart of its community.



The Richmond and Northallerton MP heard how Mrs Greenwood, who took over as headteacher just five months ago, has already raised expectations for behaviour and academic standards, which was acknowledged in the school's Ofsted inspection in December.

In the report, whilst suggestions that improvements are necessary, inspectors commented that "there is an air of optimism about the future" and "the school is increasingly ambitious for its pupils."

Mrs Greenwood shared details of the school's improvement plan and its aim to achieve at least 'Good' ratings in all areas at the next Ofsted inspection.

She said: "As the new Headteacher, it was reassuring to chat to Mr Sunak about our school improvement plan and the significant progress we have already made this year in the areas of behaviour, culture and quality of education,"

"This experience gave our young people a platform to grow in confidence, as they not only spoke to a public figure, but learned how their concerns can be represented in Parliament by their MP." Mrs Greenwood concluded.



During the visit, Mr Sunak observed a Year 7 English lesson using virtual reality (VR) technology to explore the Globe Theatre in London as part of a Shakespeare project.

The school has embraced new technologies in teaching, integrating VR to create immersive learning experiences that enhance engagement and deepen understanding.

Mr Sunak also met student-led groups, including Service Pupil Ambassadors, Pupil Librarians, and Pupil Mental Health Ambassadors, who play vital roles in supporting their peers and promoting well-being within the school community.

Mr Sunak said: "It is encouraging to see the determination of Risedale School's leadership to drive improvements. The use of innovative teaching methods, such as VR, alongside strong student-led initiatives, shows a real commitment to providing the best possible opportunities for students. I am confident the school will continue to make great strides forward."
